Abstract

1 cm → This document contains the instructions for preparing full-text manuscripts for IRC 2025 E-Proceedings. The manuscripts should be typed on the A4 (21 cm x 29.7 cm) paper. Please follow the guideline explicitly. Only English manuscripts are accepted. **It is recommended to copy and paste the text using 'Keep Text Only' to maintain the format of the template. All text boxes, arrows, and other graphic elements in the template should be deleted before submitting the manuscript.** The abstract should include a concise statement of objectives and a summary of important results. The maximum length of the abstract must not exceed **250** words.

Keywords: Keyword1, Keyword2, Keyword3 (Three to five keywords should be provided, separated by a comma, and must be written using Times New Roman 11 pt, single-line spacing.)

1. Introduction

1 cm → This document contains the instructions for preparing a manuscript for the IRC 2025 E-Proceedings [1]. The manuscripts should be typed on the A4 (21 cm x 29.7 cm) paper. Please follow the guideline explicitly. Only English paper is accepted. Contributed papers are limited 4-6 pages including all figures, graphs and tables [2]. Each manuscript typically contains the following sections:

1. Title
2. Authors name (No academic position is required.)
3. Address in Details (Give Phone and Fax. Numbers, E-mail if available)
4. Abstract
5. Text including Introduction, Experimental methods, Results and Discussion, Conclusion
6. Acknowledgment (if needed))
7. References.

Manuscripts are typed with a “1.5 lines” space except for heading. Font type should mimic Times New Roman #10 (show here), as closely as possible. Bold should be used for the paper title (#12), subtitle (# 10). The manuscripts must be typed in 2-column format with the correct width as shown in this example, but the abstract and keyword must be typed in one-column [3].

2.2 Equations

Equations have to be numbered consecutively throughout the text. The equation number should be placed in parenthesis and flushed with the right-hand margin of the column [4].


Figures, tables, and graphs should be positioned within the text. They must include caption.
